## Addendum to APSARD Conflict-of-Interest Disclosure Form

### Additional Details re: Question 2:

I was part of a coalition comprised of members from the following organizations

- *National Association of Continuing Education (NACE)* – the Lead Organization
- *Albert Einstein College of Medicine/Montefiore Hospital* - the CME Provider
- *American Professional Society of ADHD and Related Disorders (APSARD)* – the Content Consultants

that wrote a proposal for an Educational Grant from Pfizer, called “Getting with the Guideline,” which would offer CME conferences and access to a web portal for primary caregivers (mostly pediatricians) who wanted to learn more about the 2011 American Academy of Pediatrics’ *Clinical Practice Guideline for the Diagnosis, Evaluation and Treatment of ADHD in Children and Adolescents*. After the grant was awarded, I also created lecture content and slides for the CME program, as part of the Planning Committee (for which I was paid by NACE), and I am one of the course faculty. I am paid an Honorarium by NACE and am reimbursed my travel expenses by NACE, when I speak at these CME events. Pfizer has had absolutely no involvement with the development of the course content; I was free to create these talks as I judged best.

There will be some outcome measures that we will use to assess the effectiveness of these CME programs, and these could be construed as “research.” So, although NACE was awarded an educational grant from Pfizer, and I have been paid only by NACE, I’m not sure whether the outcomes research we plan to do qualifies this project as a discloseable COI, or whether this just should be categorized as typical unrestricted-pharma-funding-of-a-CME-program. I *think* this really should be considered a typical CME course, since I am paid only by NACE, but I wanted to double-check with you to see if anyone thinks I need to mention Pfizer, somewhere in Question 2.
